SERMON ON THE AMOUNT

Tres Dias is a lay movement. It does not receive any financial support from the church, though some congregations have chosen to contribute. So where does the money come from? It comes from all of us, the community – from team members, sponsors, congregations, and pastors. Each and every one of us has experienced the gift that is Tres Dias. Then, individually, we have done what God, through the Spirit, has moved us to do to support this ministry. And guess where we found our guidance – in prayer. We've given prayers, love, time, abilities, and money so that this movement can continue and that others may experience a walk with Christ in this unique way.

Tres Dias exists by God's grace through faith, love, and prayer! Somehow the bills get paid. God provides. While you may have paid for your original weekend as the Cleveland movement started, there is now only a \$50 application fee. Finances and logistics are provided by free-will donations that come from the heart and obedience to the moving of the Holy Spirit within each of us. The following information is provided so that if, through prayer, the Spirit moves you to help pass on the gift of Tres Dias, you have some idea of the current costs of a weekend.

When you add up the facility rental, insurance, food, chocolate, beverage, crosses, and miscellaneous supplies, the cost of a weekend comes to about \$175 per person – pretty inexpensive considering the “glimpse of heaven” these three days of grace affords. By all accounts, this is a reasonable expense and every effort is made to balance costs with the essentials of the weekend.

If you decide to contribute, pray about the method and the amount. Some people contribute in lump sums once, twice, or three times a year. Some send in smaller amounts monthly. Others seek out a specific expense related to a weekend and pay for that. Non-monetary support in the form of general food palanca and other supplies is also welcome. No matter what your tangible response is to the leading of the Spirit, please remember this movement in your prayers as the Spirit brings it to mind – and respond ONLY as God directs you. PLEASE do not do anything until you have prayed over it.

If you feel led to make a monetary donation, please make checks payable to Tres Dias Cleveland, and send to Ted Kurz. Remember that charitable donations are tax deductible and are often suitable for matching gifts by employers.

May the grace of our Lord be with you all.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Ever wonder what it costs to put on a weekend? You may find the following summary information interesting.

Weekend Expenses

Site Rental	\$10,500
Other expenses	<u>800</u>
Total	\$11,300

Projected Weekend Income

Team Fees	\$4,725
Candidate Fees	<u>1,500</u>
Total	\$6,225

Summary of Weekend Funds

Total expenses	\$11,300
Total proj income	<u>6,225</u>
Projected Shortfall	\$ 5,075
Less site deposit paid	<u>1,600</u>
Additional Funds Needed	\$ 3,475

Since there are two weekends in October, we need additional funds of \$6,950 (2 X \$3,475) to cover the shortfall. Much of the shortfall is due to the difference between the candidate's application fee (\$50) and the actual candidate weekend cost (\$175).

As of August 4, our checking account balance was approximate \$8,400.
